

## EDWIN W. HARN.

Edwin Washington Harn, 76 years old, one of the last survivors of the Independent Patapsco Guards of the Union Army, died Thursday at his home, 4030 Belle avenue, Forest Park. Death was due to a nervous breakdown.

Mr. Harn was born near Woodbine, Carroll county, and was a son of the late Ephraim Harn. He enlisted in the Independent Patapsco Guards at Ellicott City, but was later transferred to the Second Maryland Regiment. He served as a dispatch bearer.

At the close of hostilities he was engaged as superintendent of the weaving rooms of the Alberton Mills, at Alberton, for 30 years. He later retired and began farming in Carroll county. He was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic and of Aberdeen Lodge of Masons.
